From completing SECAPs to launching concrete climate projects, Turkish CoM municipalities have shown exceptional progress in their climate action plans. The number of municipalities in Türkiye signing the Covenant of Mayors has surged, growing from **32 in 2021 to 86 by the end of 2024** and still growing. This growth reflects the mounting ambition and resolve of local governments to take bold steps towards achieving climate goals.

Together, we are building a future where climate actions is led by communities, and the resilience of our cities and towns will stand strong in the face of the climate challenges ahead.



TÜRKİYE-LITHUANIA COOPERATION IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF SUSTAINABLE ENERGY AND CLIMATE ACTION PLANS

4-5 DECEMBER 2024



From the 3rd to the 6th of December 2024, a delegation from Türkiye took part in a study visit to Lithuania as part of the "EU4 Energy Transition: Covenant of Mayors in the Western Balkans and Türkiye" project. The aim of the visit was to **promote cooperation and exchange of best practices in the field of sustainable energy and climate policy between Türkiye and Lithuania.**

The delegation included representatives from the Ministry of Environment, Urbanisation and Climate Change of the Republic of Türkiye, UCLG-MEWA and the MLGP4Climate Platform **partner municipalities of İstanbul, Diyarbakır, Konya, Bandırma, Safranbolu, Melikgazi, Karatay, Çorlu, Bağcılar and Kuşadası.**



LITHUANIA STUDY VISIT

4-5 December 2024

Within the scope of the Study Visit on Türkiye-Lithuania Cooperation in the Implementation of Sustainable Energy and Climate Action Plans, the first day visits were organized to Central Project Management Agency (CPVA), Lithuanian Ministry of Environment and Environmental Project Management Agency (APVA).



During the meeting with CPVA, international partnerships and projects implemented by the agency were presented.



Bandırma Mayor Mr. Dursun Mirza, his team, and CPVA representatives expressed their mutual appreciation for this valuable collaboration.



LITHUANIA STUDY VISIT

4-5 December 2024

In the meeting with the Lithuanian Ministry of Environment, the policies implemented by the ministry on sustainable waste management and water management were shared.



Water Sector Regulation: The Lithuanian Ministry of Environment oversees policies and coordinates efforts across stakeholders, including municipalities and regulatory bodies, to ensure safe and quality drinking water and effective wastewater management. Centralized systems cover 82% of drinking water and 79% of wastewater services.

Deposit Return System: Introduced in 2016, this system transformed beverage packaging recycling rates. Prior to its implementation, only 33% of beverage packaging was recycled. Today, over 90% of all deposit packaging is recycled, positioning Lithuania as a global success story in waste management.



LITHUANIA STUDY VISIT

4-5 December 2024

During the meeting with the **Lithuania Environmental Project Management Agency (APVA)**, the Agency's strategic approach to implementing environmental and climate investment policy was presented. APVA, plays a key role in coordinating national and international efforts, ensuring sustainable development and promoting green transformation.



APVA engages in numerous international initiatives to promote best practices and foster global partnerships:

- **EU Twinning Projects**
- **Development Cooperation:**
 - Lithuania's development cooperation projects extend to Armenia, Moldova, and Georgia, promoting shared expertise in environmental policies.
- **LIFE Integrated Projects**



The meeting saw the participation of representatives from Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality and Çorlu Municipality, who provided valuable input.

LITHUANIA STUDY VISIT

On the second day of the study visit, meetings were held with the Association of Local Authorities of Lithuania (ALAL) and the City of Vilnius.



Roma Žakaitienė, Director of the Association of Local Authorities in Lithuania (ALAL), provided information on the role of the Lithuanian Association of Local Authorities in climate action through the Covenant of Mayors (CoM) initiative, the implementation of energy efficiency, the use of alternative energy sources and other climate change measures, and the financial instruments used.



Mayor of Akmene Vitalijus Mitrofanovas made a presentation on the city's plans and projects related to climate change and energy.



The Mayor of Safranbolu, Ms. Elif Köse, also took part in the meeting with her team, offering valuable contributions.

Diyarbakir Metropolitan Municipality's commitment to sustainability and resilience is a testament to its proactive approach in driving climate action and inspiring regional transformation.

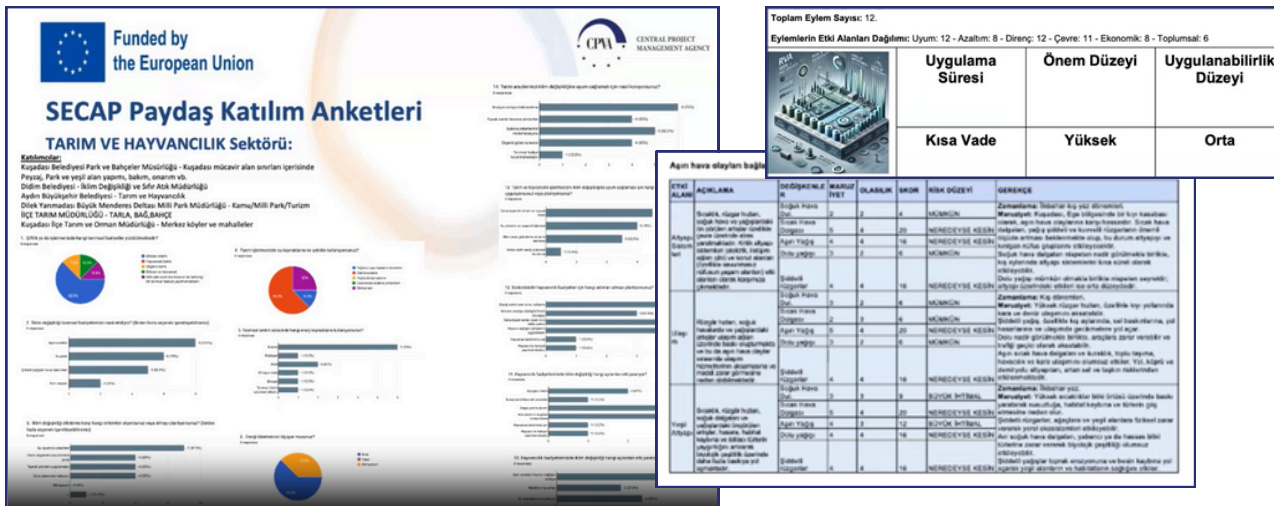


KUŞADASI MUNICIPALITY SECAP CONSULTATION WORKSHOP

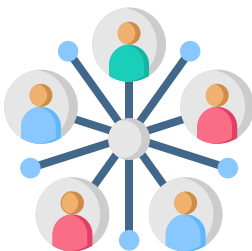
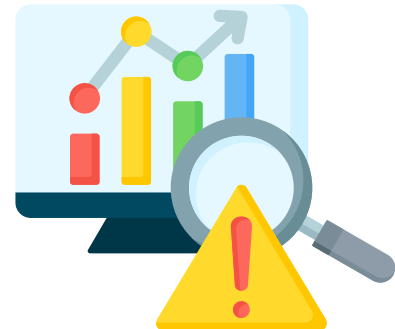

Ms. Daiva Matoniene, Project Team Leader of the EU4ETTR, provided a comprehensive update on the project's progress from May to November 2024 and outlined goals for the remaining months. Ms. Matoniene's presentation emphasized activities under six project outputs, lessons learned, and key findings:

- The MLGP4Climate Platform has become fully operational, with nearly **100 members**, CoM municipalities, Infographics have been prepared to introduce MLGP4Climate partner municipalities.



- In MLGP4Climate Platform library more than 245 sources are present including Baseline Emission Inventory Preparation Guide for supporting municipalities in their SECAP journey. The library also includes training videos on various topics.



During the 6-month period, capacity building activities reached **25 municipalities**, SECAP preparation progressed for 10 municipalities and financial workshops were held with the Gap Fund.



- Over the course of the project, the number of CoM signatories in Türkiye increased **from 32 to 86**.



- Technical support was provided to **3 winners of the First Climaax Open Call** and to **11 municipalities for the EU-TR CCGP call**.



- **Over 600 participants** attended MLGP4Climate events in the past six months.

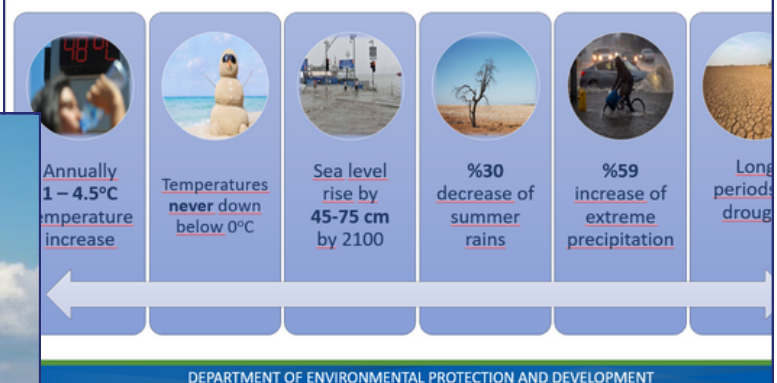

Prof. Dr. Ayşen Erdinçler, Head of Department of Environmental Protection and Development at Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality, presented the megacity's climate change policies, projects and challenges. **Prof. Dr. Erdinçler** emphasised that İstanbul's SECAP, as a signatory of the Global Covenant of Mayors (GCoM), was prepared with the support of the EU4ETTR project and that an IT monitoring tool is being developed in cooperation with MLGP4Climate to track the implementation of the SECAP and serve as a model for other municipalities.

As a GCoM member, the municipality reports its greenhouse gas inventory to the CDP annually.



- Waste to energy in Istanbul has reached an annual electricity generation of 1,316,908 MWh. This is equivalent to the annual electricity needs of 2.5 million people.

Mr. Özcan Caymaz, Project Coordinator of Melikgazi Municipality

Mr. Özcan Caymaz, Project Coordinator of Melikgazi Municipality, shared insights into the municipality's sustainability initiatives and emphasised the importance of public engagement and collaboration.

Mr. Caymaz highlighted the municipality's swift transition to being a CoM signatory and preparing its SECAP. Mr. Caymaz explained that, with CPMA's grant support, the municipality implemented projects such as installing solar panels and electric vehicle charging stations.



Mr. Caymaz emphasised that the EU4ETTR project has fostered communication and exchange of experience with various institutions and networks, with CPMA and widely.

Mr. Hüseyin Ayvaci, Director of Strategic Development of Çorlu Municipality, gave a presentation about Çorlu, noting that the region's high industrial activity increases its vulnerability to climate change.



Çorlu signed the CoM in 2019 prepared its SECAP in 2022, using 2019 as the baseline year. Çorlu became one of the pilot municipalities of MLGP4Climate in 2023.

Çorlu received a grant from CPMA for the CARPORT project, which will be completed in 2025.



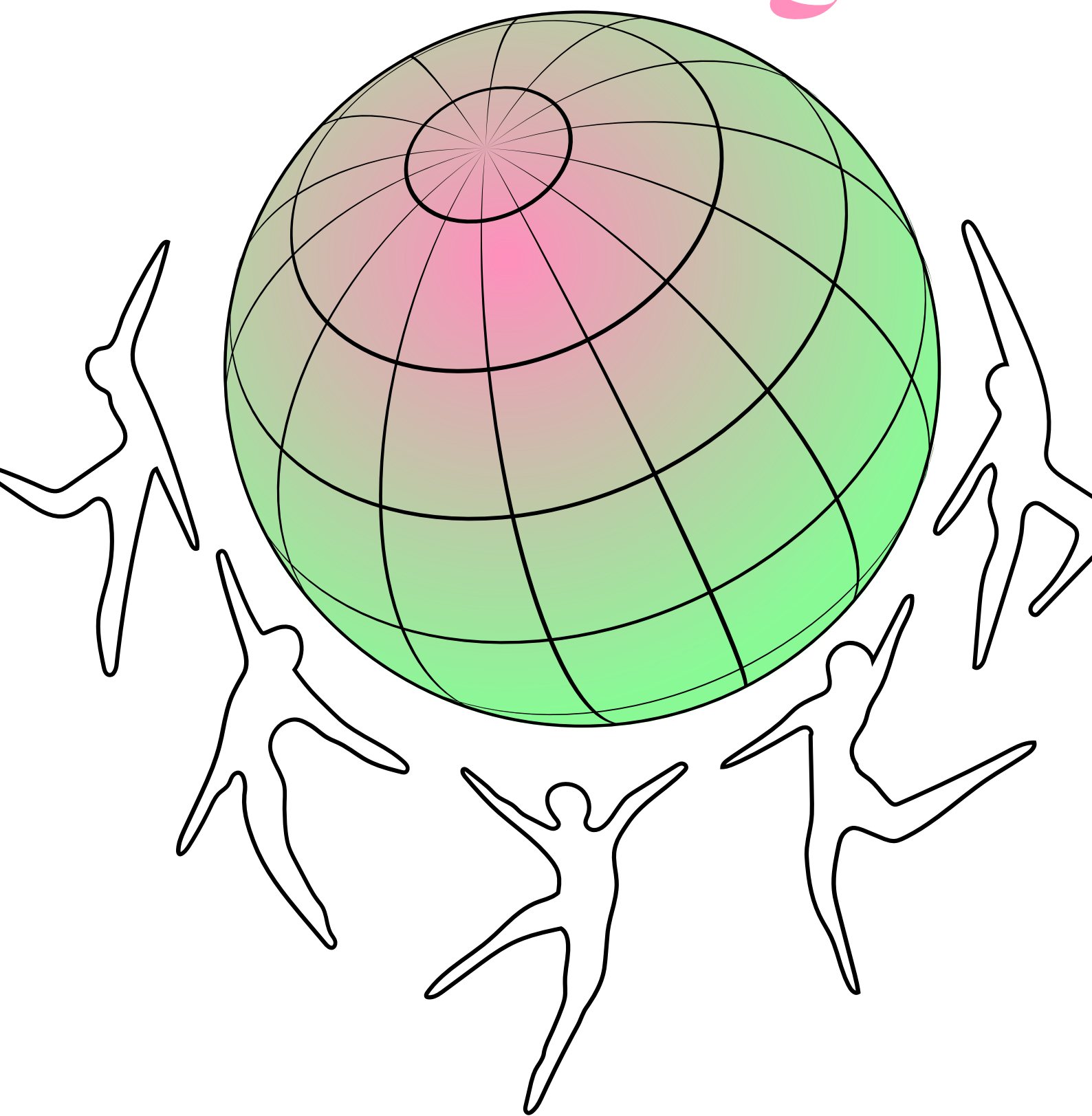


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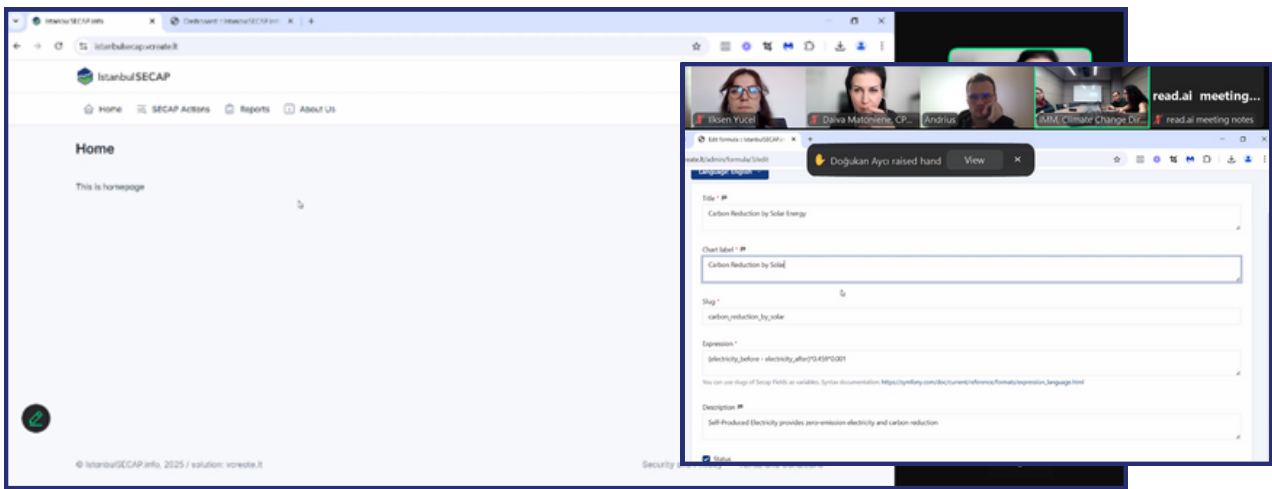

- **Promoting sustainable energy use and effective energy bill management strategies.**

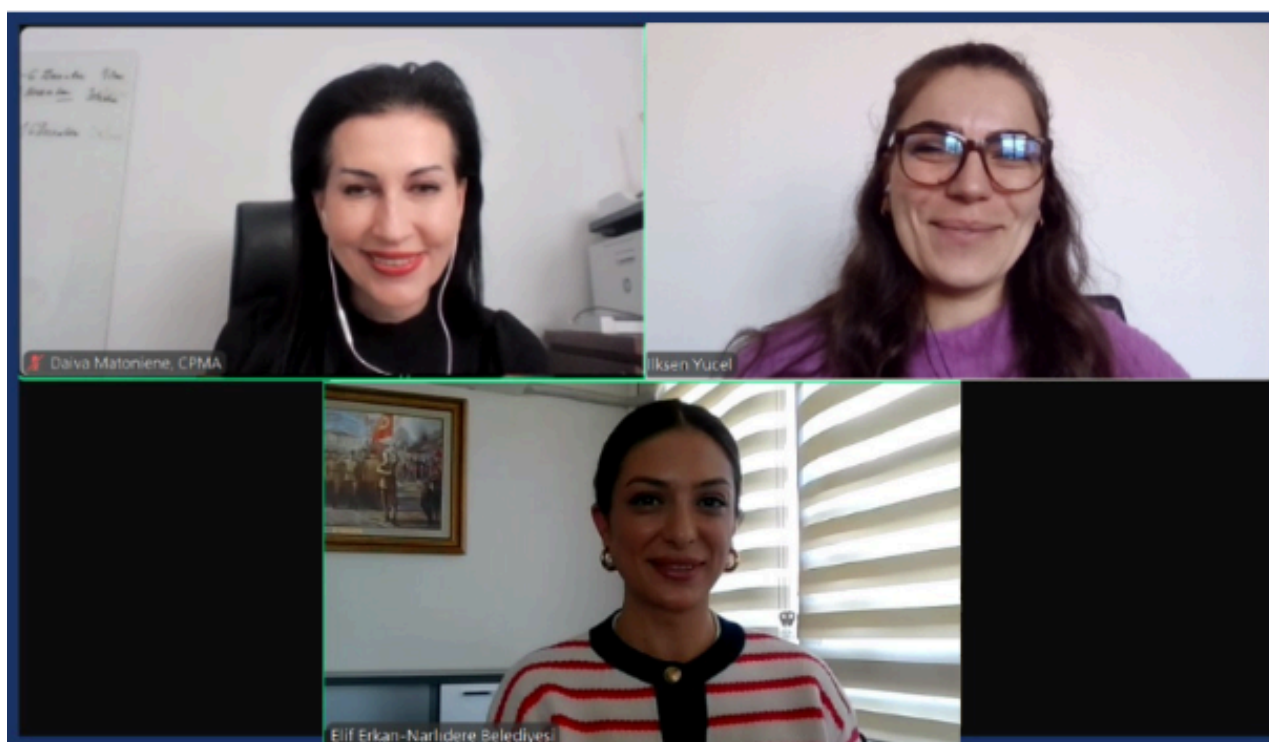
This training is an important step in supporting Bağcılar Municipality's efforts to tackle energy poverty and advance its SECAP implementation.

Within the scope of “Financial Call: EU-TR Climate Change Grant Program (CCGP) for Sustainable Energy And Climate Action Plans (SECAPs) Actions Implementation” various meetings were held with project partners and cooperatives for ten projects.



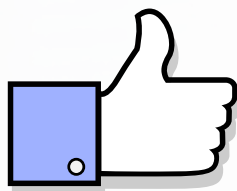
The process included extensive support in enhancing concept notes, with specific attention given to aligning them with the call's objectives. This support involved providing detailed guidance, suggestions, and corrections to ensure the concept notes were well-structured and SECAP target-oriented.

Within the project's scope, active engagement took place with various municipalities, universities, directories, and NGOs. Bilateral meetings were conducted with the applicants to facilitate the review of the concept notes.



Efforts were focused on improving the content and structure of the concept notes, accompanied by strategic recommendations to strengthen their alignment with the call requirements.

MLGP4CLIMATE : CONSULTANCY PROVIDED 11 TURKISH MUNICIPALITIES



RECOMMENDATIONS



Assisting in the preparation of concept notes for project applications across ten diverse institutions within a condensed timeframe has offered a valuable and enriching experience.

It has been observed that various institutions adopt distinct methodologies for formulating project concept notes. These approaches are influenced by the team's prior experience with European Union projects, the size of the team involved, and the specific priorities of municipalities.



Understanding the priorities of municipalities and clearly demonstrating how these priorities align with specific projects can enhance engagement and encourage institutions to take ownership of the initiatives. Municipalities which have prepared SECAPs demonstrated good understanding of priorities and important actions.

Training organizing sessions can be considered for candidates to enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of project applications. These sessions could be conducted online or in person to facilitate thorough project preparation.





TIPS FOR PROPOSAL WRITING

The project should be anchored by a central objective that aligns with SECAP guidelines. Following the establishment of this primary goal, it is essential to identify secondary objectives and corresponding actions designed to facilitate the achievement of the main objective.

To promote clarity and effectiveness, these actions should be articulated in measurable terms, and the overall plan should be organized accordingly.

Before beginning the concept note preparation, it is essential to thoroughly review the guidance and annexes of the call to manage the concept note and project preparation phase effectively. Ensure that the application form includes the required information, such as the PIC number and EuropeAid ID number, as these procedures must be completed before submitting the application.
